GEORGE WASHINGTON

Description: Exceedingly rare hand addressed free frank, 6 x 3", by Washington to, "Messrs Rob.t Lewis & Sons, Merchs., Philadelphia." and hand signed in the lower left corner, "Free G:o Washington."

ABRAHAM LINCOLN

Description: Civil War-dated document on vellum signed as President, one page, 14.25 x 17.25", dated February 19, 1863. President Lincoln appoints James F. Lamdin as "a Chief Engineer in the Navy." Boldly signed at the conclusion by Lincoln and countersigned by Secretary of the Navy Gideon Welles.

JOHN ADAMS

Description: Scarce Pre-Revolutionary official document under the reign of King George III, double-sided, dated on the reverse, November 9, 1768. Document has been folded to show portion relating to John Adams with five lines in his hand and signed in full.

THOMAS JEFFERSON

Description: Ink signature as President in his hand, "Free, TH: Jefferson, Pr. US," on an off-white 2.5 x 1" slip clipped from a free frank envelope.

JAMES MADISON

Description: Ink signature as President in his hand, "James Madison," on a vellum 3.25 x 2.5" slip clipped from a document.

JAMES MONROE

Description: Ink signature as President in his hand, "James Monroe," on a vellum 2 x 4.5" slip clipped from a document.

JOHN QUINCY ADAMS

Description: Ink signature, "J Q Adams," in the hand of Adams, on an off-white 1.5 x .5" slip clipped from a letter, mounted to a larger slip.
