



Letter of Authenticity

DESCRIPTION: Napoleon Bonaparte – an original Millionaire Gallery display featuring an exceedingly rare museum quality military letter penned in the hand of the Emperor of the French and signed at conclusion, one page, 7 x 9”, 19 July 1810. War dated letter to his Minister of War inquiring as to what an aide-de-camp of the Prince of Pontecorvo (Marshal Bernadotte) is doing in Quimper, Brittany. Penned and signed by **Napoleon** at the height of his power during the Peninsular War. A note by one of Clarke’s secretaries is pinned to the lower left, indicating that the letter will be replied to right away.

The signature(s) is/are consistent considering slant, flow, letter size, pen pressure, and other characteristics that are typical of the known exemplars that we have examined in our professional careers.

This display has been archivally designed and preserved using 100% acid-free materials, archival Mylar, and UV Treated TruVu Museum plexi-glass. **NOTE:** It is **HIGHLY CAUTIONED** that this display as well as all artwork be kept out of direct sunlight.
