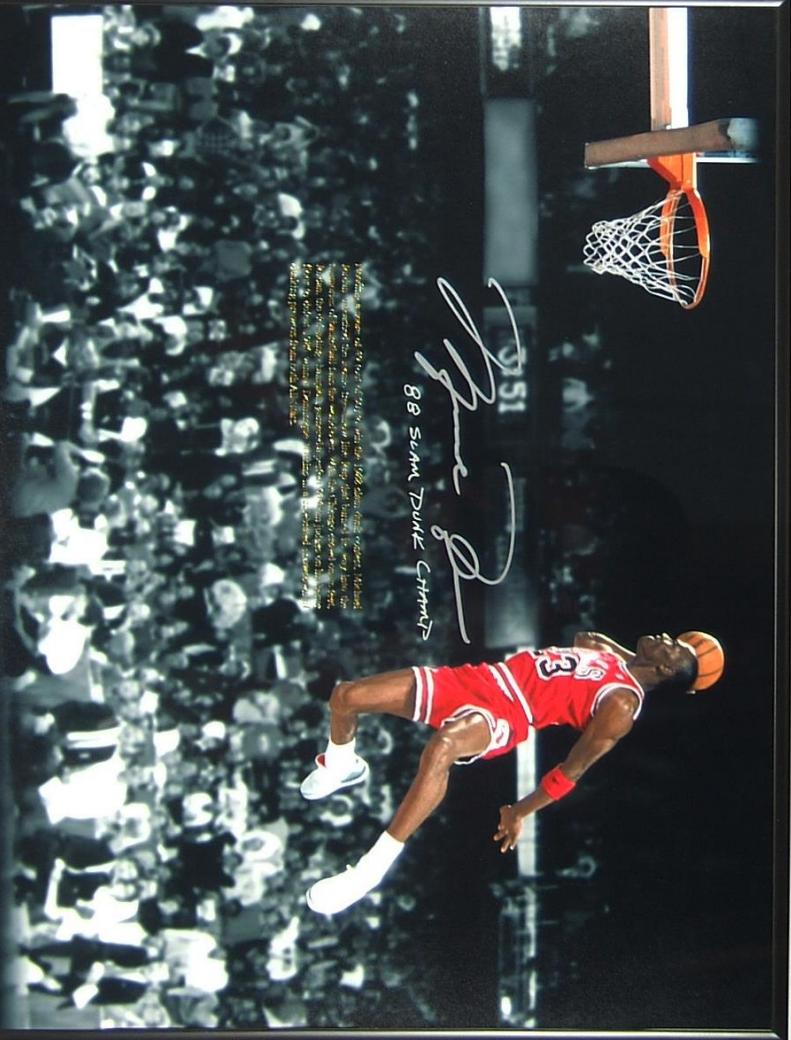

In 1988, he performed a "Jordan Special" dunk, which was a combination of a dunk and a layup. He was the only player to perform a dunk that was not a slam dunk.
